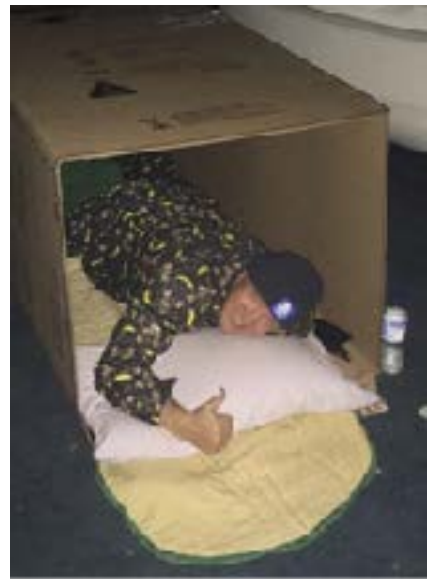

Whilst the temperature only dropped to just below 8°C degrees C last night, it felt a lot colder than this to David Shumack and me as we slept in our cardboard boxes in the undercover area. Last night, however, was the only night that we will experience the cold conditions and the hard ground. For many in our community, sadly, this discomfort is a nightly occurrence. It is easy for us to sit in judgement of these people but the reality is that we are rarely aware of the circumstances that have led them to be in this position. The message that we have tried to convey to the children is that we shouldn't judge these people, rather we should look for ways to support them and help to regain their dignity and sense of self-worth. Hopefully the \$800 that was donated for wearing our pyjamas will be put to good use by our local St Vincent de Paul chapter. As I said to some of the classes yesterday, the money we raised just may be responsible for helping to turn someone's life around.

YEAR 3 CLASS NEWS

We're half way through the term and are running on all six cylinders. We successfully completed the NAPLAN testing in Week 3 and our congratulations goes to all Year 3 students on their outstanding efforts.

In Religious Education, we have been studying one of the most important ways to strengthen people spiritually – the Mass, or Eucharist which Jesus gave his followers during the Last Supper. We support the Year 4 students as they prepare to receive the Eucharist for the first time this term.



Our integrated unit that incorporates HASS (Geography and History), Literacy (Reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening) and Visual Arts has taken us on journey around Australia. We have based our unit on 'Are We There Yet?' by Alison Lester. We have been learning about Australian states, territories, capital cities and major regional centres of Western Australia and the location and identifying features of rivers, deserts and rainforests.

Our most recent artwork focused on Australian Aboriginal artist Danny Eastwood's Uluru. We enjoyed learning about the significance of dot painting for Aboriginal people. Then, we created our own version of Uluru. We will be adding dots to our painting next week.

She brought along Veggie Man for entertainment and spoke to the children about the importance of eating a piece of fresh fruit and five vegetables a day. She also presented a certificate to Darryl Winsor that officially declares Notre Dame Catholic Primary School as a Crunch&Sip® school.

The children look forward to having Crunch&Sip® in their classroom because they get to have a short break in class to crunch on some salad vegies (like carrot sticks or cherry tomatoes) or fruit. They are also allowed to sip from their water bottle over the whole day. This helps them to re-fuel a bit like a car does with petrol, helping them to concentrate better.

Starting in July 2017, North Metropolitan TAFE (RTO code: 52786) are running a 1 semester course on the skills required to be a successful gardener/handyperson or cleaner. The course is a preparation for entry into gardening, handy work or cleaning work.

In addition, we will support you in applying for work as a gardener or cleaner.

We have feedback that there is high demand for people to fill these roles and the chances of gaining employment are strong. This course is suitable for existing gardeners/cleaners that want to up skill, people looking to change career or people looking for work.

Gardening and cleaning course will include:

- Time management
- Safe work practices
- Plant knowledge
- Gardening procedures e.g. planting, fertilising, watering
- Use of gardening equipment e.g. ride on mowers, wiper snippers
